

CHALLENGE CUP 2024 - Pace of Play Tips

The Board has committed to maintain a pace of play standard as described under our Slow Play policy on Page 17 of the Player's Book.

• All players in the group are responsible for maintaining the Challenge Cup Pace of Play. Be part of the solution, not part of the problem.

The Board recommends the following actions to improve the pace of play:

- Abandon your search for a lost ball to reduce your search time below 3 minutes if you do not readily see your ball
- Use the Challenge Cup Local Rule for a Lost Ball or Out of Bounds, located in our Standing Rules for 2024 starting on Page 26 of the Player's Book
 - o if it is virtually certain that a ball has come to rest out of bounds, there is no requirement to find the ball
- Use the Concessions and Tying Holes procedure located in our Standing Rules for 2024 on Page 29 of the Player's Book
- Have your partner continue to play a hole on her own if one player is playing poorly on a hole or has incurred penalties affecting her score on the hole
- Request to play out of turn from your opponents on a hole if you are waiting for them to play
- Ask your opponents to play out of turn on a hole if they are waiting for you to play
- If it is virtually certain that a ball has crossed into a penalty area, there is no requirement to find the ball.
 - o i.e. in an environmentally sensitive area or a horticultural bed with plants that have been designated as penalty areas
 - o Relief may be taken where the ball is estimated to have last crossed into the penalty area
- Plan your next shot before you get to your ball
- Keep your pre-shot routine short
- Be ready to hit when it is your turn to play
 - i.e. assess yardage and club selection for your shot while waiting for others in the group to play who are near you
- Mark your scores on the next tee. This practice opens up the green for the group behind you
